All training is linked directly to producing

original work, and aims to serve both individual performers and existing arts groups and organisations. Arts Lab also provides links to regional and international practitioners and audiences, through training, collaboration

PERFORMANCE TRAINING

and touring.

Training is centred around the creativity of the performer, with a focus upon theatre arts and contemporary dance and aims to serve the artistic vision and growth of exceptional talent. Training is split between developing

specific performance skills and conceiving. constructing, writing and rehearsing new work. Training and mentorship is provided by leading practitioners in Zimbabwe. and international experts in different performance areas.

The Arts Lab brings together dancers. musicians, singers, actors, writers, visual artists which leads to exploration across art forms. Tumbuka Dance Company work with performers from other renowned groups such as CHIPAWO, New Horizons, OTHER GROUPS IN THE GROUP as well as established solo artists like Edith We Utonga and John Pfumojena.

CREATING NEW WORK

The Arts Lab facilitates an experimental

space where creative visions are nurtured and artistic boundaries pushed. The result is fresh original work rooted in 7imbabwean contemporary reality.

A COLLECTIVE OF PERFORMING ARTISTS

Those who have come through the programme form part of the Arts Lab Collective which represents a pool of outstanding individual talent, managers and groups who can market. manage facilitate diverse arts-based programmes for theatres, communities. schools, development partners, corporate partners, events, festivals.

PERFORMING ARTS FOR DEVELOPMENT

As well as performance training, the Arts Lab also provides training in using the arts for communication, education and development. This forms part of the hands on training in diversifying income. Through combined training and practise participants are trained in the use of applied arts for individual and community development including forum theatre, issue-based performance for social change, drama and dance therapy, workshop facilitation, social research and project management.

Performers from Tumbuka Dance Company and theatre groups on the Arts Lab programme lead weekly community groups in high densities around Harare. These use dance and drama process to explore social. personal, political, ethical, developmental issues, working in partnership with human rights groups.

MANAGEMENT TRAINING

The programme is founded upon the belief that no artistic vision can be fully realised without sound management structures and no artist can realise their full potential if consistently struggling to make ends meet. A core strand of the Arts Lab's work is to provide arts management training to artists and groups.

In October 2011 60 performers presented audition pieces to a panel of 5 to participate in the pilot Arts Lab training programme. Following an initiation week for a group of 30, 14 Arts Lab participants, and 10 Tumbuka Dance Company members then embarked on 4 weeks of intensive training starting mid October 2011. The initial four week training workshop has taken participants through a process of training and creating new work in both comic and tragic territories. Training exercises are then used as the basis for developing performances - these are shown back to the group for discussion -

in this way training is consistently linked to creating, constructing, and performing.

The Arts Lab encourages acute observation of real life and in so doing, results in the creation of work which embodies issues, stories, behaviour, forces, plays of sincere relevance to contemporary society. The Arts Lab's process involves the study of the self, relationships, society through intense physical levels of play and critical thinking. This results in performers reaching their optimum levels of possible expression, and enables the ability to encourage playfulness and creativity in others.

The initial 4 week pilot training explored:

TRAINING 01

Observation: character development through observation of animals. Observation and embodiment of nature, places and people. Points of departure for creating work included: structuring 'the world' being thrown off balance - with 'the world' being internal or external; structuring the performance of 'an event' and 'a place' through essentialised image.

TRAINING 03

Comic territories: this included basic clown, exploration of human desires at play, mask, news review, bouffon, the surreal. Points of departure for creating work included reflecting current news, playing at adult 'activity' whilst being a child, reversing logic, playing the 'game' whilst conducting serious business, competing for attention.

Exploration in each of these areas crossed between contemporary dance, theatre and music.

TRAINING 04

Friday sharings: at the end of each week, the group presented pieces that were created through improvisation – this has become a weekly ritual for the Arts Lab workshop and aims to be a space where groups outside and from within the lab, can share new work, test and discuss performance ideas.

TRAINING 02

Tragic territories: basic training and exploration in this territory focussed on expression epic landscapes and emotions in contained space, a journey through the elements -fire, water, air, earth melodrama, tragic chorus, and the condition of the tragic hero. Provocation for creating work included: a departure, a tragic chorus warns society, a heroic choice.





Kyokushinkan black belt. has competed in music crossroads competition. Was a part of HIFA between 2009-2011.








